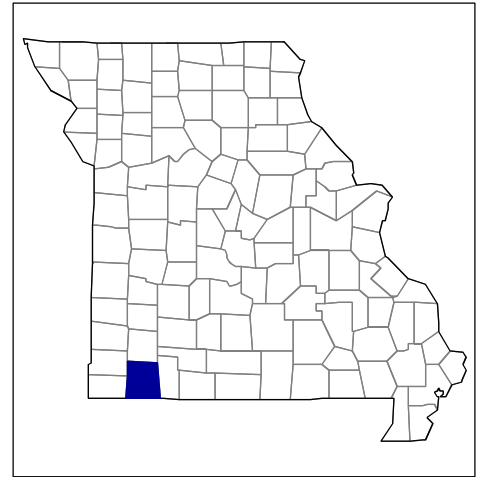




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

\$201,399,000 in 2002, \$153,920,000 in 1997, up 31 percent.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

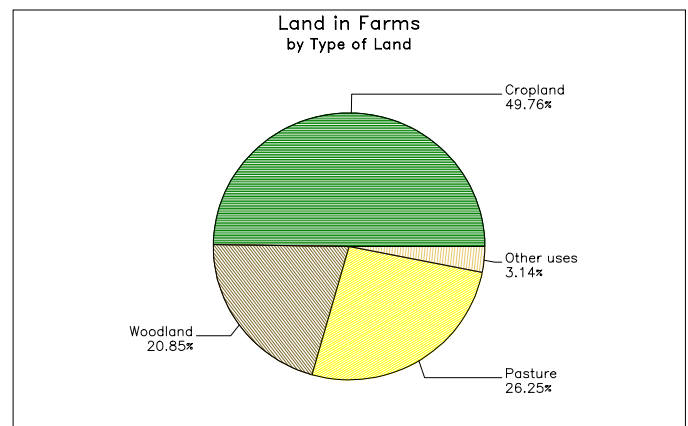
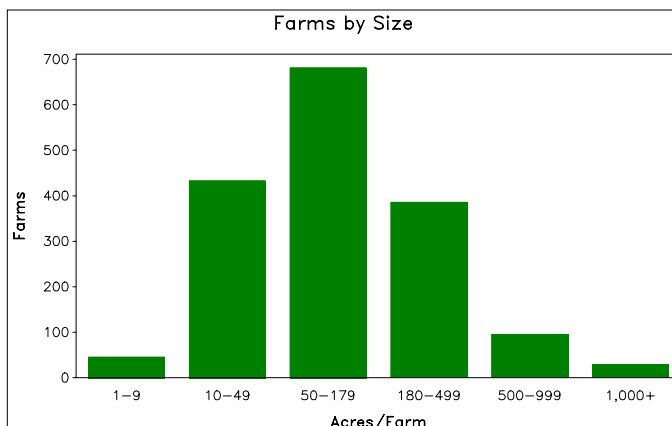
\$120,670 in 2002, \$86,667 in 1997, up 39 percent.
