

708,728 acres in 2002, 782,189 acres in 1997, down 9 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$76,095,000 in 2002, \$63,433,000 in 1997, up 20 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$40,535,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$35,560,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$70,852 in 2002, \$63,243 in 1997, up 12 percent.


Government Payments
