

\$8,000,000 in 2002, \$12,726,000 in 1997, down 37 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$960,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$7,041,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$57,146 in 2002, \$101,805 in 1997, down 44 percent.


Government Payments
