### Market Value of Production, average per farm

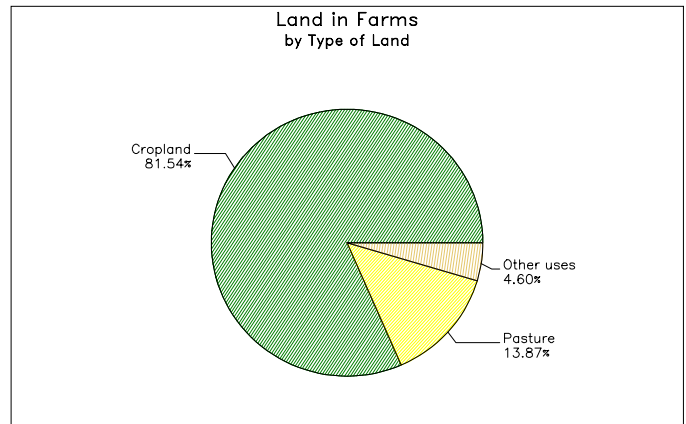
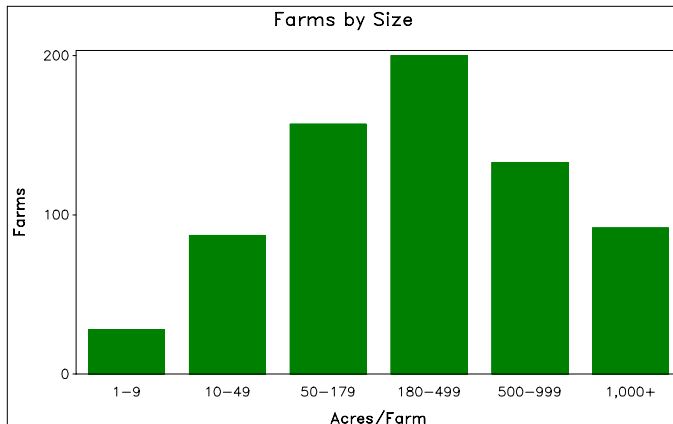
\$174,550 in 2002, \$143,199 in 1997, up 22 percent.
