

706 acres in 2002, 642 acres in 1997, up 10 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$43,489,000 in 2002, \$44,142,000 in 1997, down 1 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$18,379,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$25,110,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$97,073 in 2002, \$86,215 in 1997, up 13 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
