

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$15,241,000 in 2002, \$26,215,000 in 1997, down 42 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,598,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$11,643,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$81,069 in 2002, \$117,558 in 1997, down 31 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
