

#### **Number of farms**

667 farms in 2002, 661 farms in 1997, up 1 percent.

112,339 acres in 2002, 113,654 acres in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Average size of farm

168 acres in 2002, 172 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$31,712,000 in 2002, \$36,081,000 in 1997, down 12 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$21,144,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$10,568,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$47,544 in 2002, \$54,586 in 1997, down 13 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
