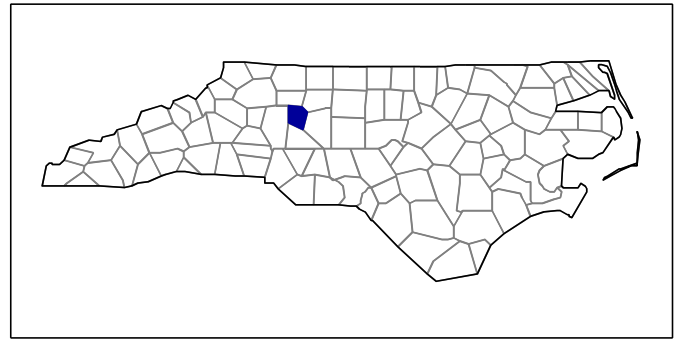

Market Value of Production, average per farm

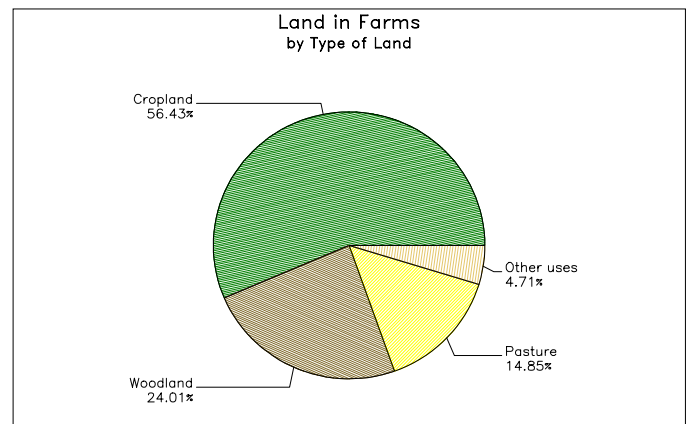
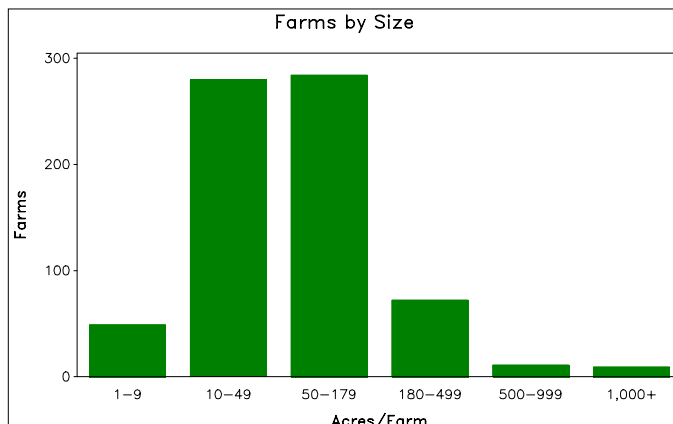
\$19,908 in 2002, \$23,163 in 1997, down 14 percent.
