

194,211 acres in 2002, 216,748 acres in 1997, down 10 percent.

170 acres in 2002, 153 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$145,513,000 in 2002, \$181,188,000 in 1997, down 20 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$66,679,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$78,834,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$127,197 in 2002, \$127,597 in 1997, down slightly.


Government Payments
