

\$18,122,000 in 2002, \$29,334,000 in 1997, down 38 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$14,890,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,232,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$48,454 in 2002, \$64,469 in 1997, down 25 percent.


Government Payments
