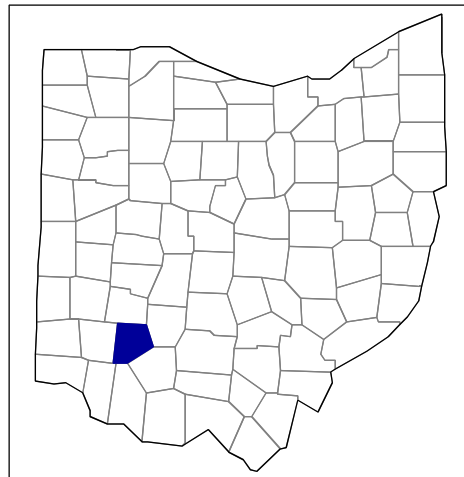


## 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Clinton, Ohio



#### Number of farms

811 farms in 2002, 848 farms in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### Land in farms

238,805 acres in 2002, 225,714 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### Average size of farm

294 acres in 2002, 266 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

#### Market Value of Production

\$52,864,000 in 2002, \$66,679,000 in 1997, down 21 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$47,067,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$5,797,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm

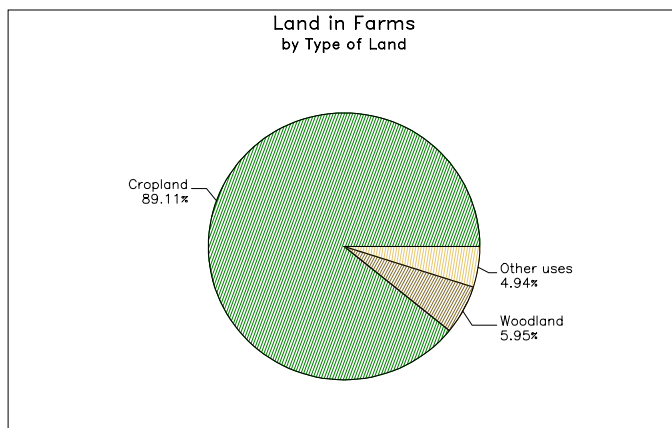
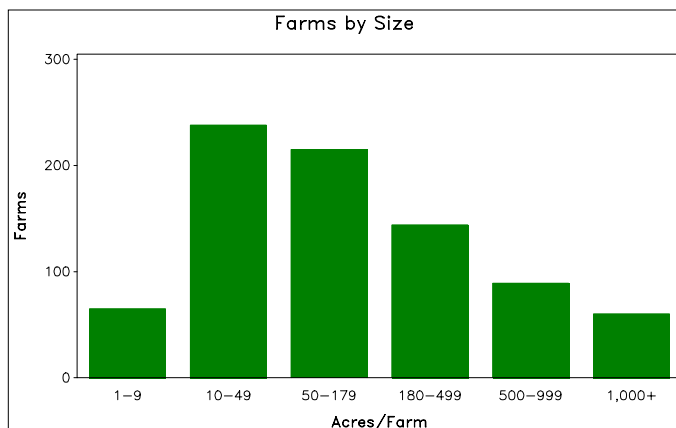
\$65,183 in 2002, \$78,631 in 1997, down 17 percent.
