

Market Value of Production

\$16,830,000 in 2002, \$10,548,000 in 1997, up 60 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$2,147,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$14,683,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$37,399 in 2002, \$20,763 in 1997, up 80 percent.


Government Payments
