


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Choctaw, Oklahoma

#### **Number of farms**

1,095 farms in 2002, 1,102 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Land in farms

337,443 acres in 2002, 336,507 acres in 1997, up slightly.

## Average size of farm

308 acres in 2002, 305 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$29,019,000 in 2002, \$24,638,000 in 1997, up 18 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,002,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$26,017,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$26,501 in 2002, \$22,358 in 1997, up 19 percent.


## **Government Payments**
