

262,626 acres in 2002, 269,918 acres in 1997, down 3 percent.

426 acres in 2002, 424 acres in 1997, up slightly.

Market Value of Production

\$13,925,000 in 2002, \$17,827,000 in 1997, down 22 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$898,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$13,026,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$22,568 in 2002, \$28,030 in 1997, down 19 percent.


Government Payments
