\$17,313,000 in 2002, \$14,712,000 in 1997, up 18 percent.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

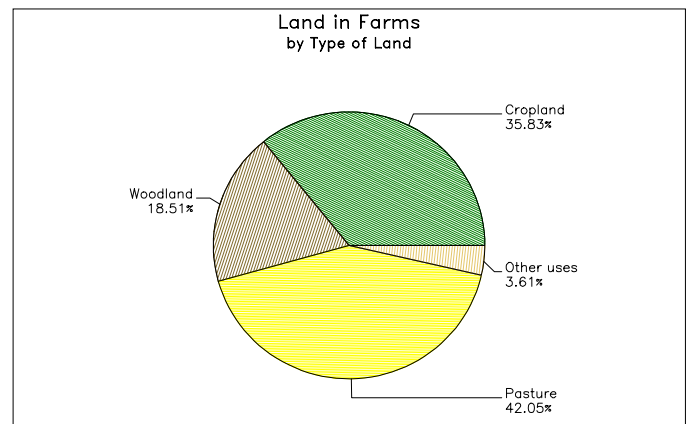
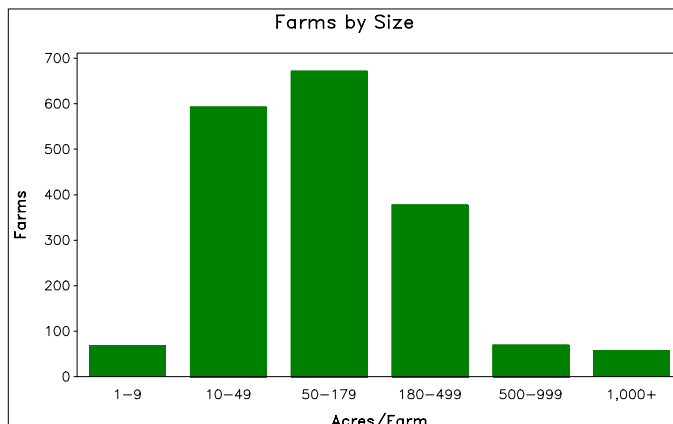
\$9,420 in 2002, \$8,484 in 1997, up 11 percent.
