

\$74,711,000 in 2002, \$90,232,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$32,637,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$42,074,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$68,985 in 2002, \$72,651 in 1997, down 5 percent.


Government Payments
