### Market Value of Production, average per farm

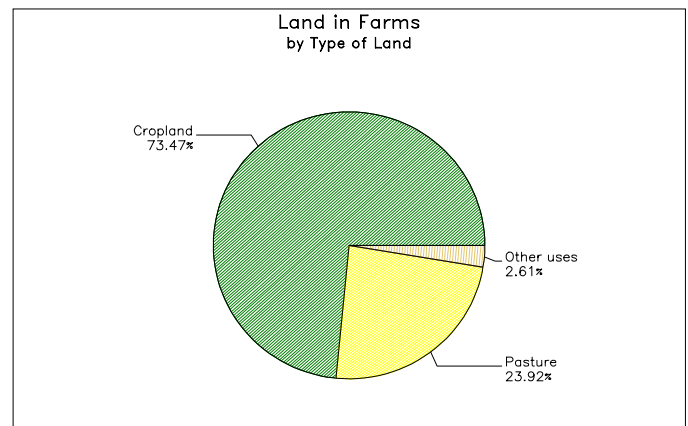
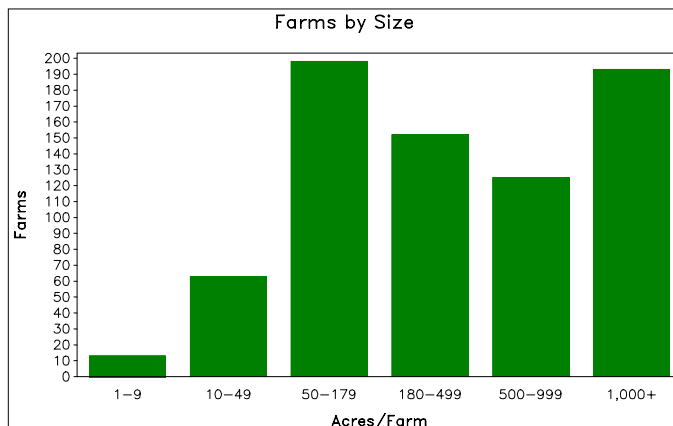
\$78,022 in 2002, \$86,254 in 1997, down 10 percent.
