

\$58,048,000 in 2002, \$69,090,000 in 1997, down 16 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$31,812,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$26,236,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$78,022 in 2002, \$86,254 in 1997, down 10 percent.


Government Payments
