### Market Value of Production, average per farm

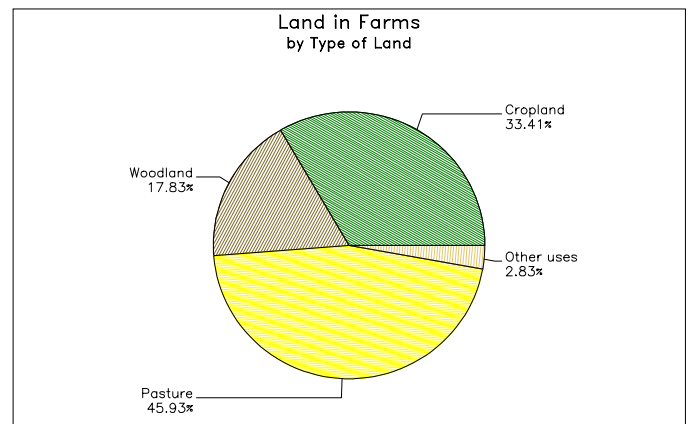
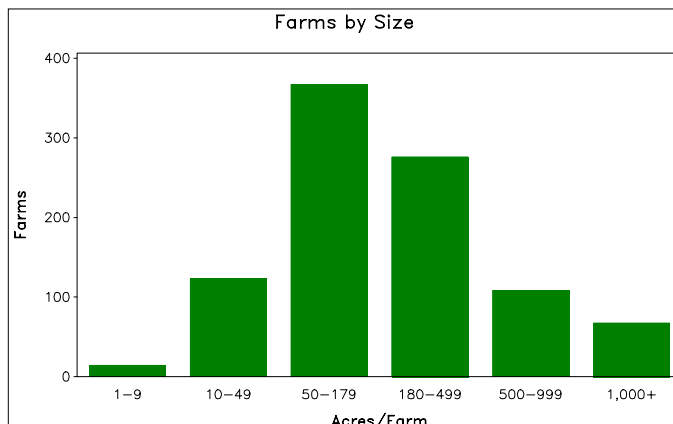
\$57,241 in 2002, \$41,062 in 1997, up 39 percent.
