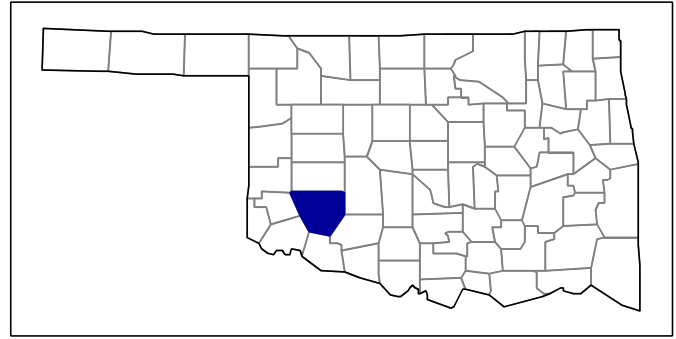

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

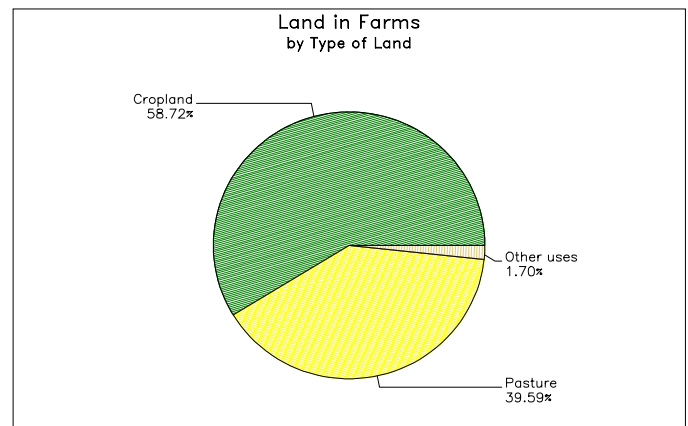
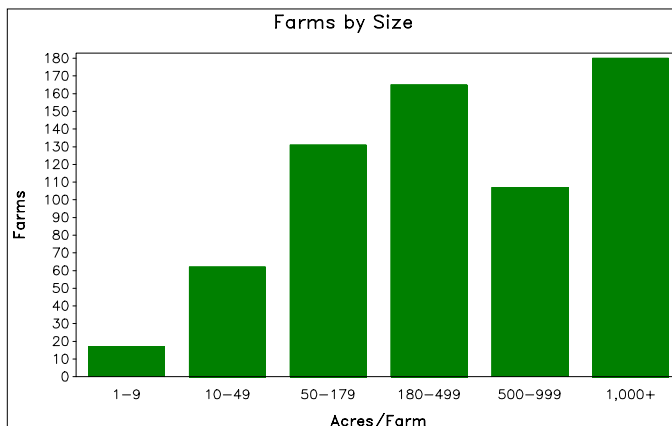
\$75,496 in 2002, \$68,660 in 1997, up 10 percent.
