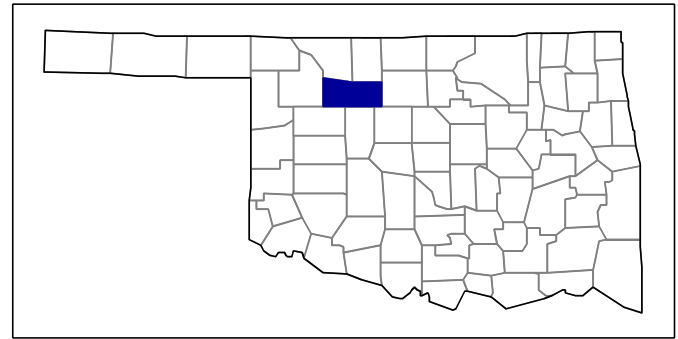

Market Value of Production, average per farm

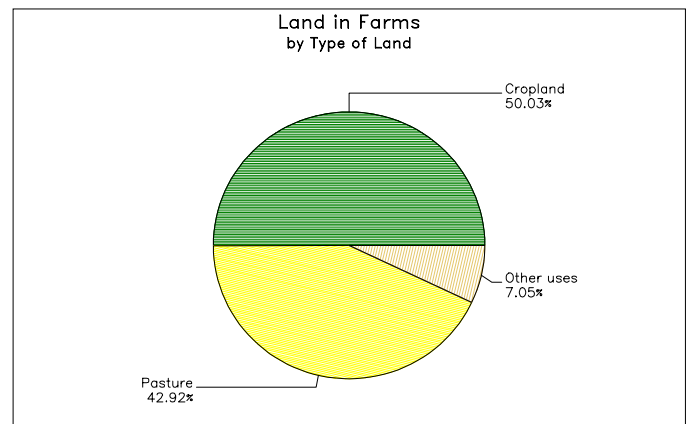
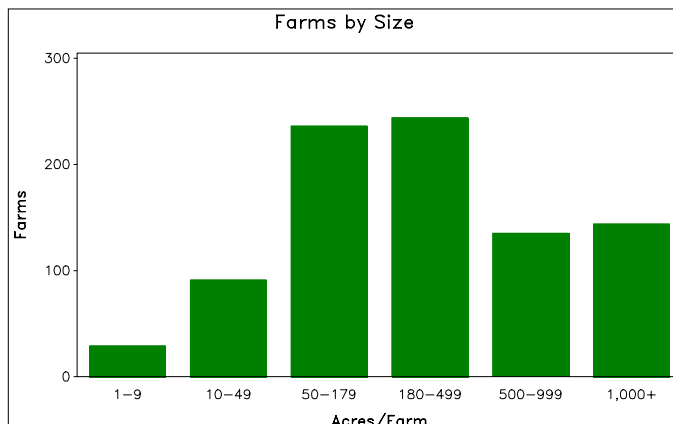
\$82,398 in 2002, \$57,365 in 1997, up 44 percent.
