

# Noble, Oklahoma

776 farms in 2002, 823 farms in 1997, down 6 percent.

395,344 acres in 2002, 427,020 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

509 acres in 2002, 519 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$34,552,000 in 2002, \$40,686,000 in 1997, down 15 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$13,302,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$21,250,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$44,526 in 2002, \$49,436 in 1997, down 10 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
