### Market Value of Production, average per farm

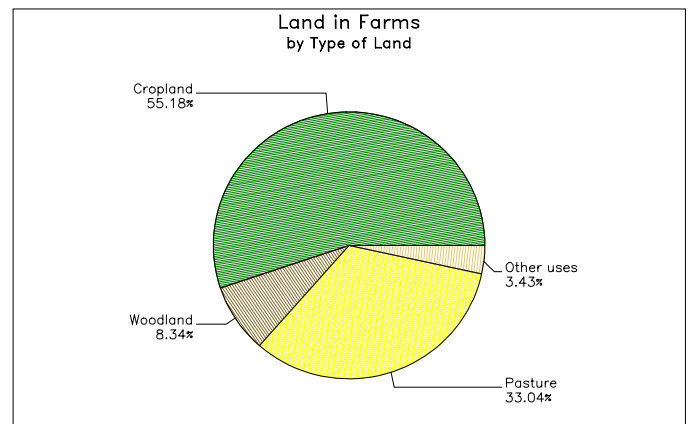
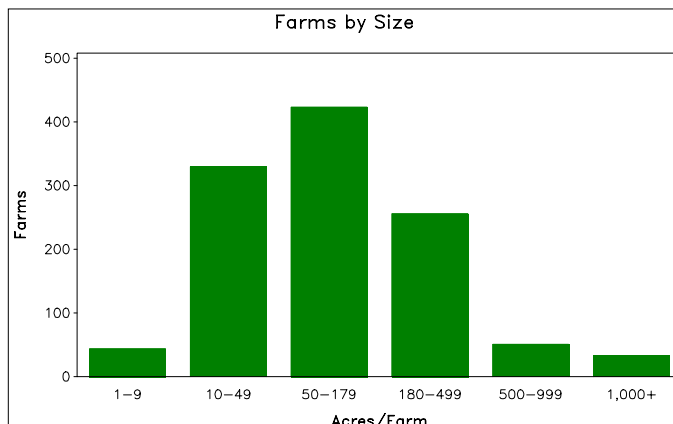
\$62,727 in 2002, \$49,452 in 1997, up 27 percent.
