### Number of farms

1,167 farms in 2002, 1,166 farms in 1997, up slightly.

279,262 acres in 2002, 289,164 acres in 1997, down 3 percent.

239 acres in 2002, 248 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$18,483,000 in 2002, \$14,743,000 in 1997, up 25 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$2,476,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$16,007,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

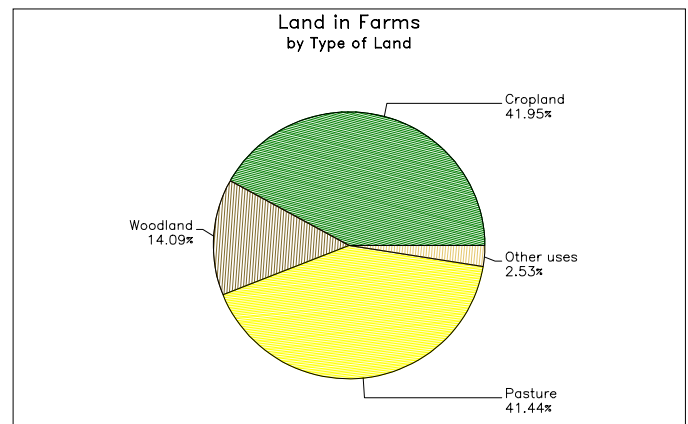
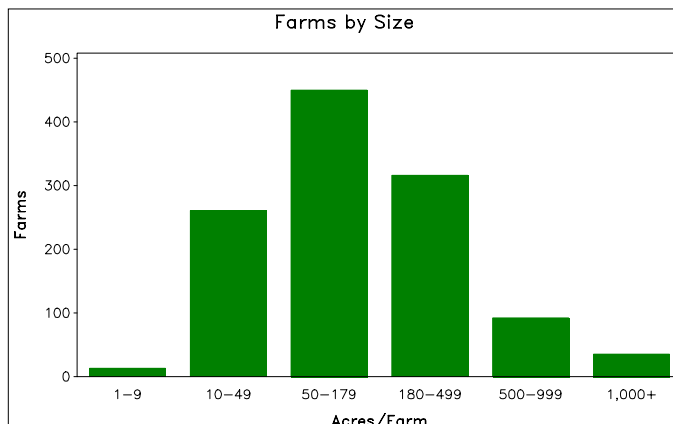
\$15,838 in 2002, \$12,644 in 1997, up 25 percent.
