


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Bryan, Oklahoma

#### **Number of farms**

1,673 farms in 2002, 1,690 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Land in farms

458,275 acres in 2002, 424,395 acres in 1997, up 8 percent.

#### Average size of farm

274 acres in 2002, 251 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$54,508,000 in 2002, \$32,742,000 in 1997, up 66 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,879,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$42,629,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$32,581 in 2002, \$19,374 in 1997, up 68 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
