

# Washington, Oklahoma

## **Number of farms**

847 farms in 2002, 898 farms in 1997, down 6 percent.

#### Land in farms

222,882 acres in 2002, 240,080 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

#### Average size of farm

263 acres in 2002, 267 acres in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$19,726,000 in 2002, \$16,650,000 in 1997, up 18 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$4,102,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$15,624,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$23,289 in 2002, \$18,542 in 1997, up 26 percent.


### **Government Payments**
