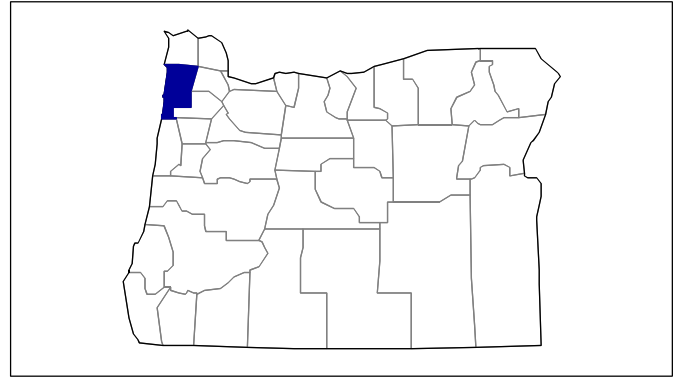




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



## Tillamook, Oregon

### Number of farms

333 farms in 2002, 354 farms in 1997, down 6 percent.

### Land in farms

39,526 acres in 2002, 36,551 acres in 1997, up 8 percent.

### Average size of farm

119 acres in 2002, 103 acres in 1997, up 16 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$88,948,000 in 2002, \$63,072,000 in 1997, up 41 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$946,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$88,002,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

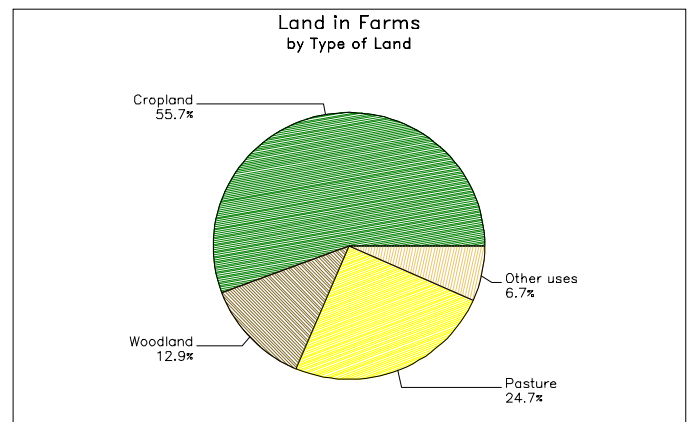
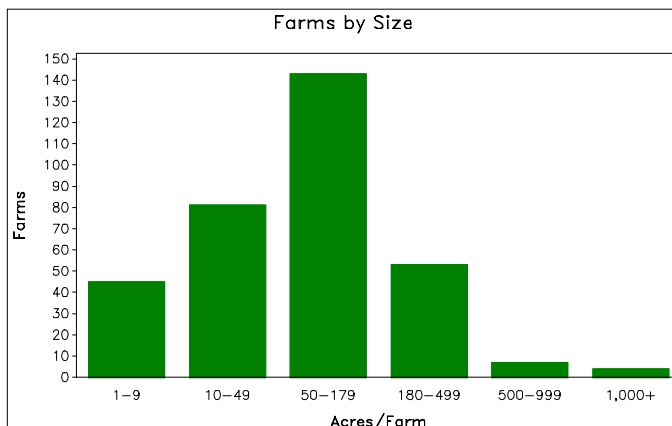
\$267,110 in 2002, \$178,169 in 1997, up 50 percent.
