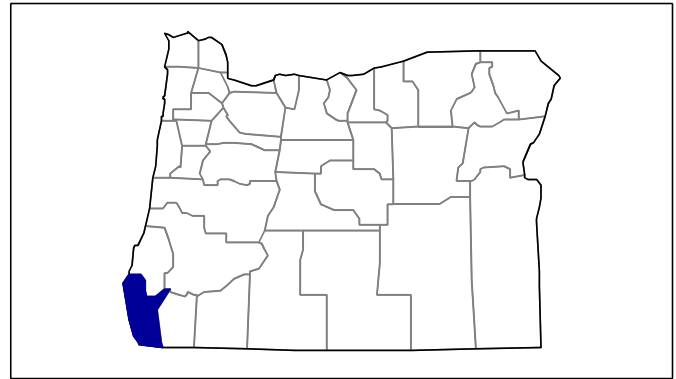




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



## Curry, Oregon

### Number of farms

207 farms in 2002, 195 farms in 1997, up 6 percent.

### Land in farms

70,459 acres in 2002, 90,090 acres in 1997, down 22 percent.

340 acres in 2002, 462 acres in 1997, down 26 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$11,733,000 in 2002, \$13,184,000 in 1997, down 11 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$7,765,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$3,968,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

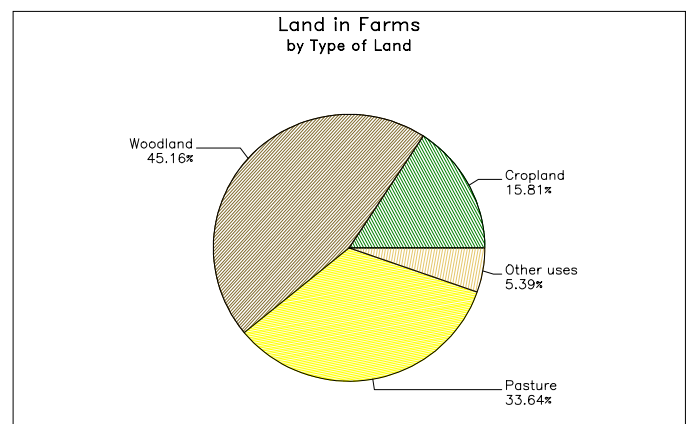
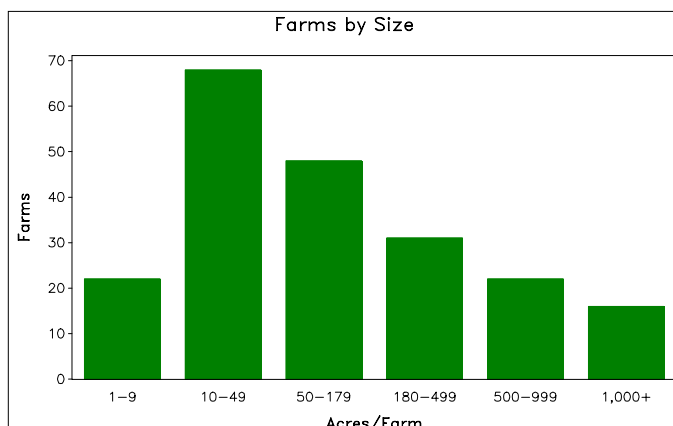
\$56,679 in 2002, \$67,609 in 1997, down 16 percent.
