


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

# Susquehanna, Pennsylvania



#### **Number of farms**

1,116 farms in 2002, 849 farms in 1997, up 31 percent.

#### Land in farms

189,287 acres in 2002, 170,882 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

#### Average size of farm

170 acres in 2002, 201 acres in 1997, down 15 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$43,143,000 in 2002, \$41,316,000 in 1997, up 4 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$2,800,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$40,343,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$38,658 in 2002, \$48,665 in 1997, down 21 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
