Crop sales accounted for \$2,724,672 of the total value in 2002.

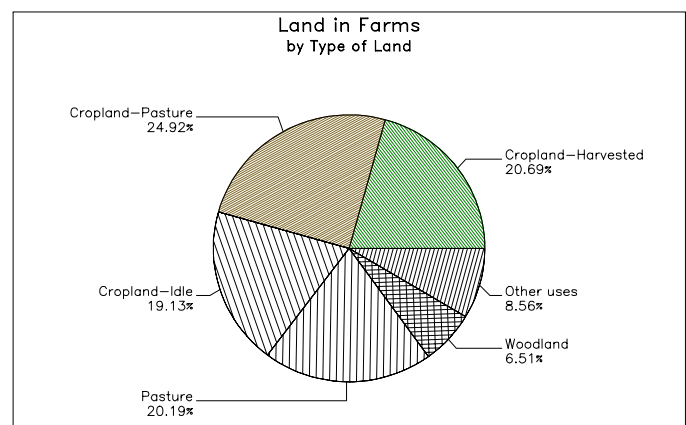
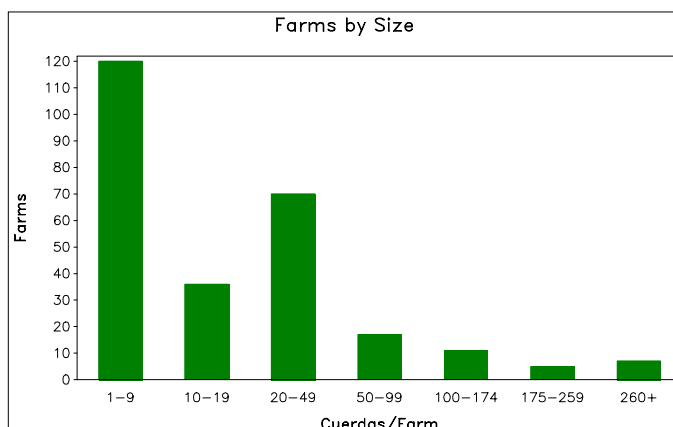
