Crop sales accounted for \$2,811,378 of the total value in 2002.

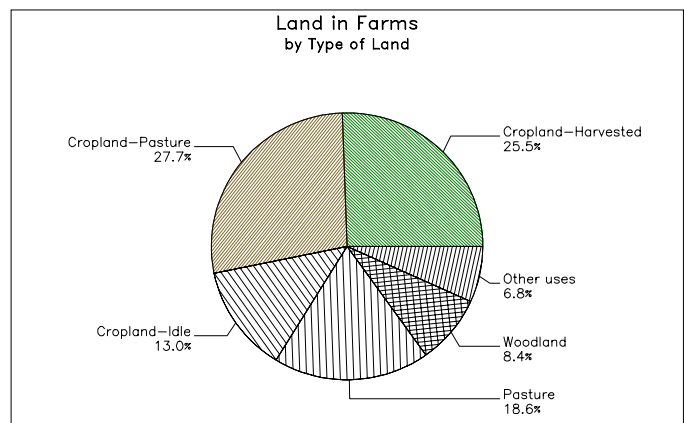
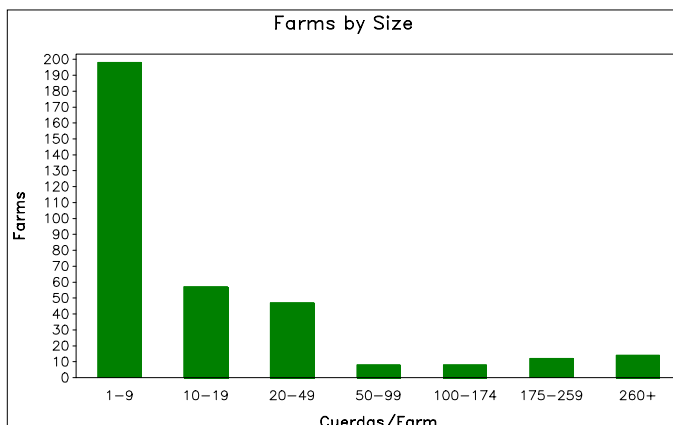
