Crop sales accounted for \$3,590,052 of the total value in 2002.

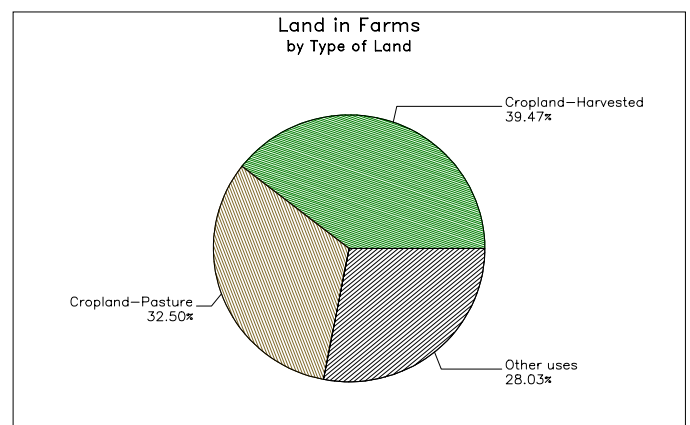
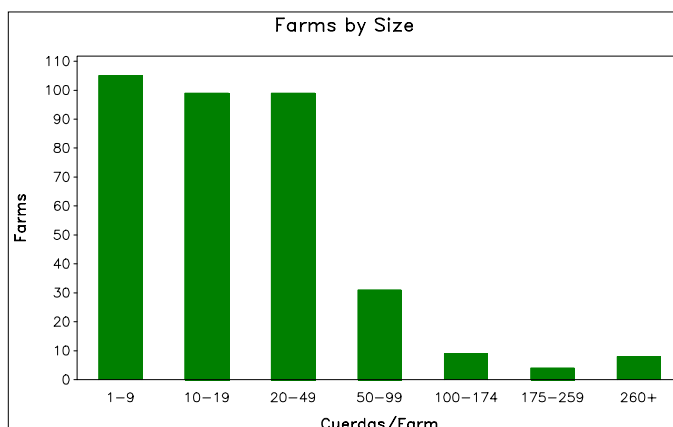
Livestock sales accounted for \$4,863,694 of the total value in 2002.
