

\$18,154,000 in 2002, \$21,037,000 in 1997, down 14 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$14,873,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,281,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$19,972 in 2002, \$20,267 in 1997, down 1 percent.


Government Payments
