

\$6,177,000 in 2002, \$16,196,000 in 1997, down 62 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,515,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$661,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$24,906 in 2002, \$65,043 in 1997, down 62 percent.


Government Payments
