

\$3,834,625,000 in 2002, \$3,664,129,000 in 1997, up 5 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,575,910,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$2,258,715,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm




