

\$37,610,000 in 2002, \$30,980,000 in 1997, up 21 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,996,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$33,614,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$109,330 in 2002, \$72,046 in 1997, up 52 percent.


Government Payments
