

480 farms in 2002, 487 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Land in farms

868,379 acres in 2002, 788,078 acres in 1997, up 10 percent.

#### Average size of farm

1,809 acres in 2002, 1,618 acres in 1997, up 12 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$76,941,000 in 2002, \$65,051,000 in 1997, up 18 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$26,322,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$50,619,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$160,294 in 2002, \$133,575 in 1997, up 20 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
