


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

#### **Number of farms**

319 farms in 2002, 352 farms in 1997, down 9 percent.

248,732 acres in 2002, 238,279 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

#### Average size of farm

780 acres in 2002, 677 acres in 1997, up 15 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$48,565,000 in 2002, \$45,073,000 in 1997, up 8 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$23,683,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$24,883,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$152,243 in 2002, \$128,047 in 1997, up 19 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
