

133 acres in 2002, 131 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$2,199,814,000 in 2002, \$2,263,035,000 in 1997, down 3 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,072,548,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$1,127,266,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm




#### **Government Payments**
