

Market Value of Production

\$20,746,000 in 2002, \$6,266,000 in 1997, up 231 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$2,173,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$18,573,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$40,362 in 2002, \$11,229 in 1997, up 259 percent.


Government Payments
