

\$38,142,000 in 2002, \$48,756,000 in 1997, down 22 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$36,121,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$2,021,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$61,125 in 2002, \$79,278 in 1997, down 23 percent.


Government Payments
