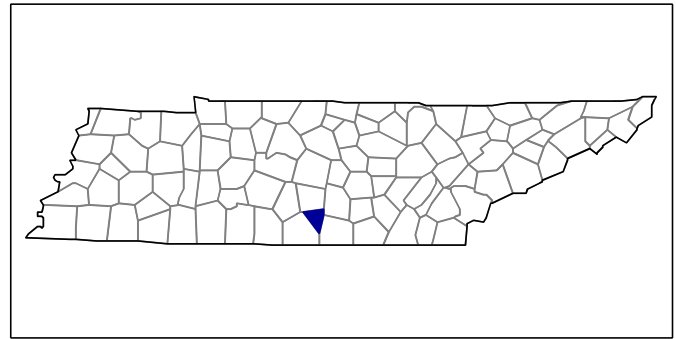




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

\$9,639,000 in 2002, \$9,873,000 in 1997, down 2 percent.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

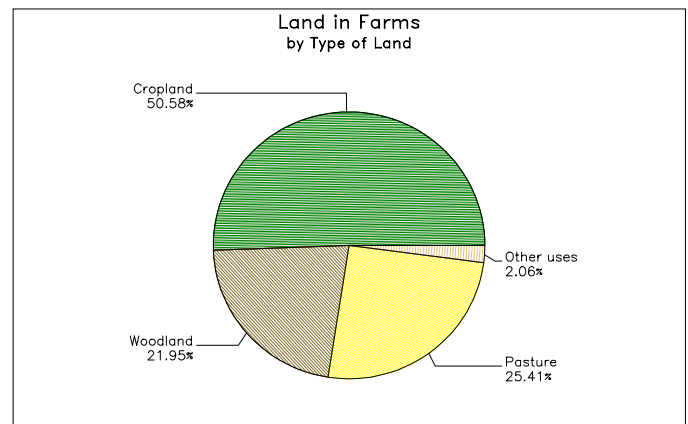
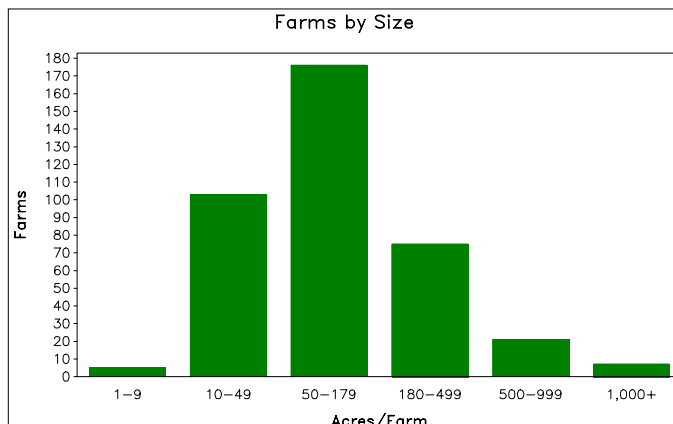
\$24,908 in 2002, \$22,490 in 1997, up 11 percent.
