

\$62,864,000 in 2002, \$65,578,000 in 1997, down 4 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$42,767,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$20,097,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$89,678 in 2002, \$77,424 in 1997, up 16 percent.


## **Government Payments**
