

# Sevier, Tennessee

#### **Number of farms**

907 farms in 2002, 957 farms in 1997, down 5 percent.

#### Land in farms

75,365 acres in 2002, 78,679 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

### Average size of farm

83 acres in 2002, 82 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$9,866,000 in 2002, \$9,709,000 in 1997, up 2 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$2,392,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$7,474,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$10,878 in 2002, \$10,146 in 1997, up 7 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
