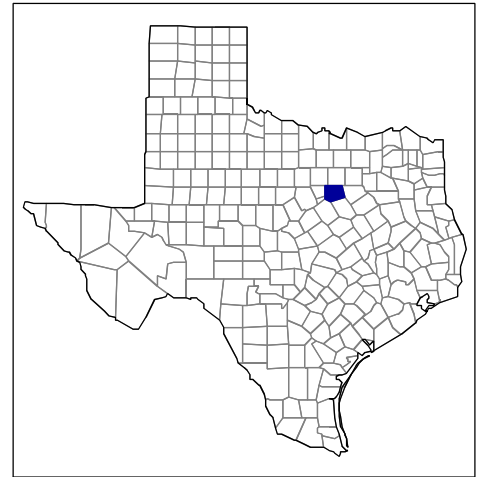




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Market Value of Production

\$43,601,000 in 2002, \$49,799,000 in 1997, down 12 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$6,754,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$36,847,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

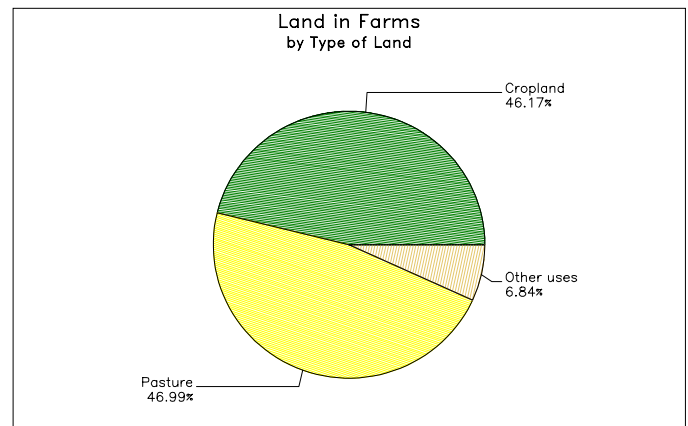
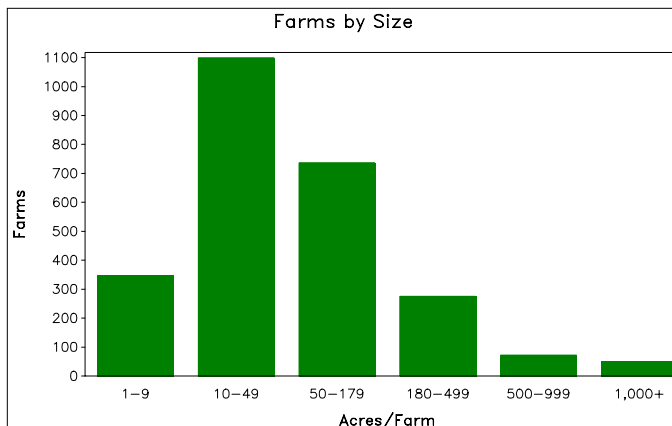
\$16,906 in 2002, \$19,833 in 1997, down 15 percent.
