

Market Value of Production

\$46,221,000 in 2002, \$46,731,000 in 1997, down 1 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,391,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$44,830,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$48,756 in 2002, \$46,498 in 1997, up 5 percent.


Government Payments
