### Market Value of Production, average per farm

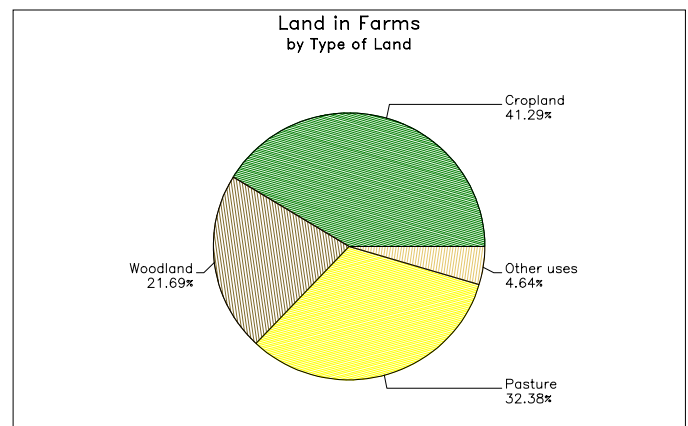
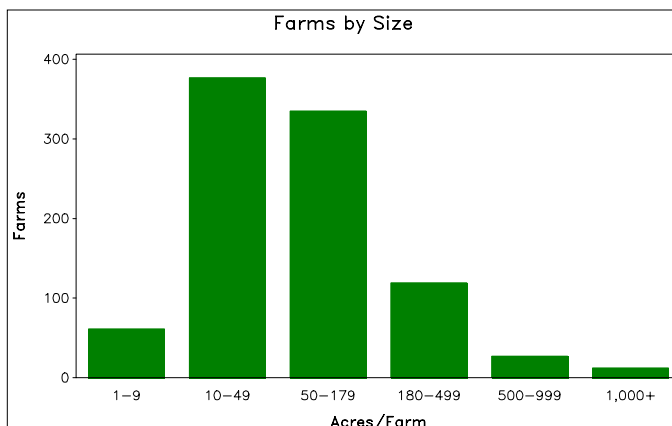
\$19,801 in 2002, \$17,109 in 1997, up 16 percent.
