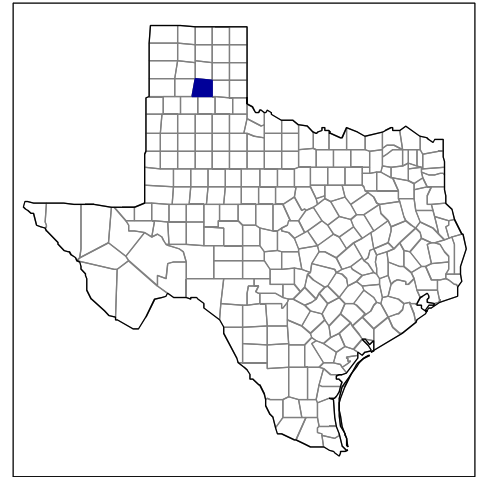




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

\$26,625,000 in 2002, \$27,756,000 in 1997, down 4 percent.

Livestock sales accounted for \$22,454,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

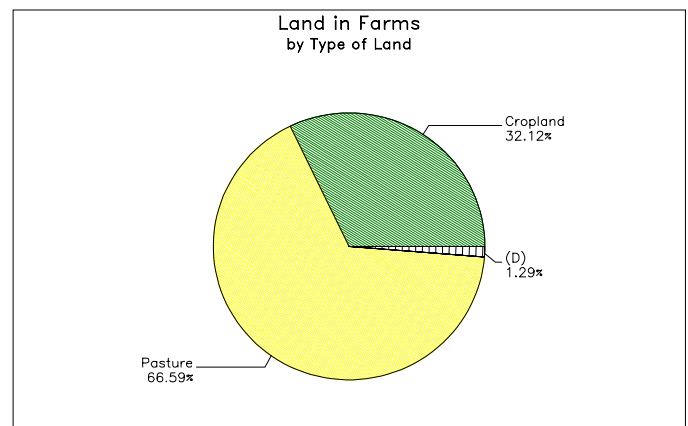
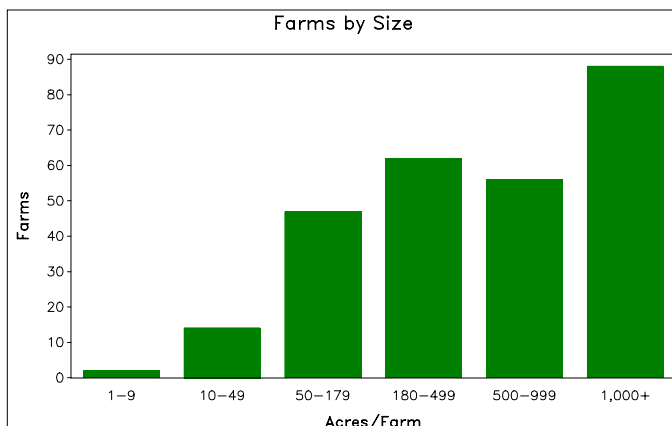
\$98,980 in 2002, \$109,274 in 1997, down 9 percent.
