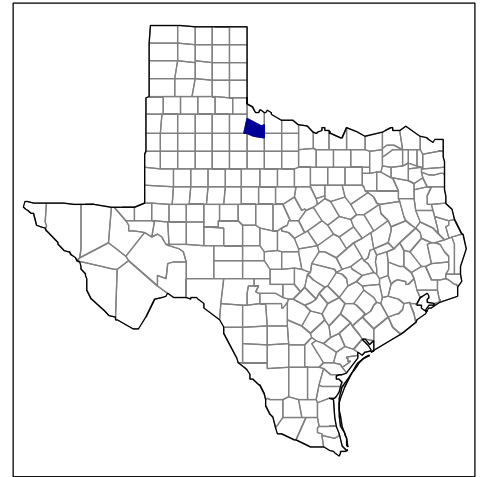


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

## Foard, Texas



### Number of farms

203 farms in 2002, 260 farms in 1997, down 22 percent.

### Land in farms

286,492 acres in 2002, 310,385 acres in 1997, down 8 percent.

### Average size of farm

1,411 acres in 2002, 1,194 acres in 1997, up 18 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$9,466,000 in 2002, \$11,354,000 in 1997, down 17 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$4,157,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$5,309,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

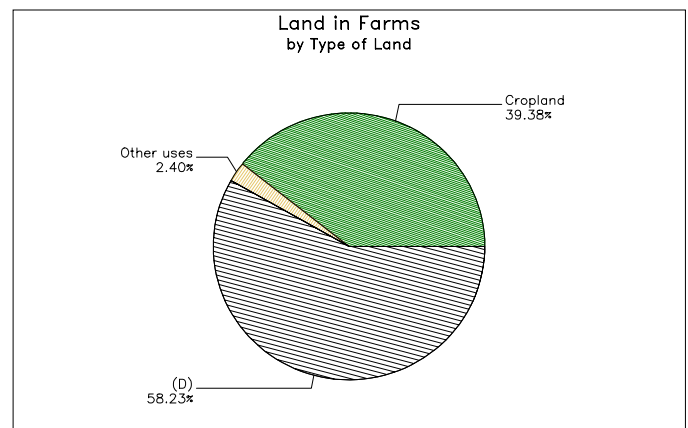
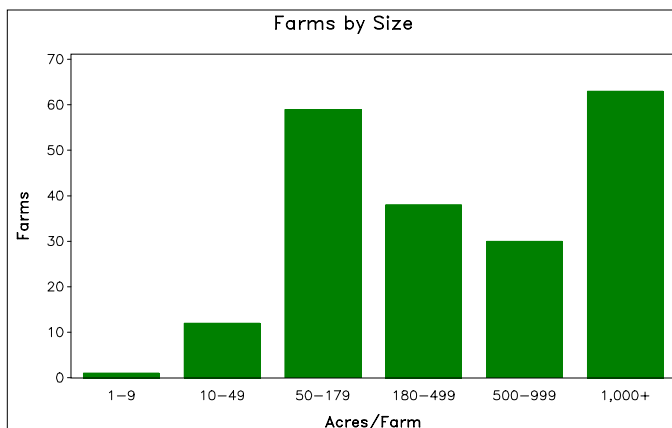
\$46,630 in 2002, \$43,670 in 1997, up 7 percent.
