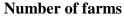


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

## Sanpete, Utah

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm






